**Editor's
Corner**



"It's good for the soul," I said.

"Maybe it's good for your soul, but it's not good for mine," replied my partner.

Bidding disasters happen to everyone. This one happened to me, in my regular partnership where we have lots of understandings. In first seat at favorable vulnerability you hold:

- ♠: J2
- ♥: KJ752
- ♦: J97
- ♣: AK7

You open a very normal 1♥, and the following auction ensues:

S W N E
1♥ 2♠ Dbl Pass
3♥? Pass Pass Pass

2♠ is weak. The double is your standard negative double. What would you have re-bid? 2NT and pass are unconscionable. 3♣ is a possibility, but more than a little misleading. At the table I chose 3♥.

Dummy tabled the following hand:

- ♠: A106
- ♥: Void
- ♦: A6532
- ♣: J9542

and explained that he passed because he thought 3♥ might be the last making contract.

I'm stuck playing in a 5 card fit at the 3

level. Surprisingly, given the 2♠ preempt by West, hearts broke 4-4 and I managed to hold it to down 4 for -200. Not pretty.

Afterwards, all of us at the table discussed my predicament. I maintained my heart bid could be temporizing with this kind of hand, lacking anything better, and partner should have rescued me to 4♣ with 5 of them and a heart void. (He promised both minors, so I could pull 4♣ to 4♦ if say my ♣A was the ♥A.) Partner said I shouldn't re-bid 3♥ without a sixth heart, and that I should take a preference to 3♣ myself since I did have the ♣AK. West thought my 3♥ bid only promised 5 of them, but that they should be better quality if I had that few. East suggested bidding 3♠, which is an overbid with this hand, asking my partner to do something intelligent since I couldn't bid anything else..

It had been a long time since I played in a five card trump suit. I can't even remember when the last time was

There is a moral to this story: don't let one bad result ruin your game. I just shrugged it off and chalked it up as an experience to toughen my bridge soul. We still finished in first even after this disaster.

We still haven't figured out the right answer to this one. I'd love to hear your thoughts on the matter.

The news from Jay Baum, the ACBL CEO, is all promising. Membership is up, as are attendance at clubs and tournaments. We have signed a contract with a public relations firm to develop a viable school bridge program. There is no question that if we cannot promote bridge to young people, we will never be able to even maintain our current membership of 168,380. Marshal Frank and Robin

Brown have succeeded in getting bridge as an after-school activity at one school in Westchester.

District 3 is looking for a Newpicate Director at our four regionals each year. We need a person who wants to encourage new players to join the ACBL and play bridge at all levels of competition - clubs, sectionals, regionals and NABCs. The person will need to pass the ACBL's Director's Course, which I am told is not too difficult, and then be able to direct the Newpicate games at all four regionals - six days, two sessions per day. It is possible we may find two people and split the job between them. The Newpicate players who play both sessions are served a light lunch, and there is either a review of the day's hands or a short lecture. The director will be in charge of making this lunch and giving the lecture, or finding someone who will. This is not a volunteer job - salary is commensurate with experience. I want to mention the passing of Bob Katz, an icon of bridge in Westchester, on January 22. He was the full-time director when the Bridge Deck first opened, where he was a partner, and eventually the sole owner. He was an ACBL Associate National tournament director before he retired

from directing full-time. Everyone knew they could count on Bob to help them with a difficult director's call or a scoring problem. He came out in all kinds of bad weather to make sure things ran smoothly. He directed all over the northeast, and was one of the most respected directors for his various abilities. As a player, he was almost as good as he thought he was. When we played together, he always asked me when I was going to learn how to play. (I do wonder that myself quite often.) My deepest sympathy to Idelle, their children Nancy and Martin, as well as the grandchildren. Bob will be missed and remembered.

The Grand National Teams Event for District 3 will be held on April 2. For flights B & C it will be a two session Swiss Teams. For the championship flight and Flight A, there will be a KO (which may last beyond Saturday, depending on entries; arrangements for future matches will be made by the surviving teams). Winners in all flights will receive a \$500 stipend and free entries to the GNT finals in Atlanta. A complimentary brunch will be served before the event. In Memory of Bob Katz

It is with a sincere and deep sense of sorrow that we record the passing of one of the pillars of our bridge community, Bob Katz. After a protracted illness, he passed away at home on January 22, 2005.

Bob was the founder and one of the original owners of the Bridge Deck in Hartsdale. Bob was considered by all to be the quintessential judge of ethical behavior and honesty at the bridge table. He was an expert player and renowned director who understood the nuances of "the Laws" giving him a "Solomonic" ability to resolve the stickiest or problems. All players had

confidence in Bob's "fair and unbiased" rulings.

Bob never had the time to compete as much as he would have liked. But he was a fierce competitor. While winning the last tournament event he played in, he remarked after making an inconsequential bidding error, "I know this won't stand in the way of us winning, but if someone has to make an error, I just wish it wouldn't be me." His intellectual honesty and desire for perfection was never far from the surface.

Bob's integrity and gentlemanliness were his hallmarks,



but he also had an infinite store of warmth and compassion for his friends and family. He recognized when those close to him needed his help. He was truly a giant of the human spirit.

Bob, we will truly miss you!

Convention Hall

Smolen

If you have been reading the Editor's Corner, you know that I have had several adventures with this convention recently. This article will present several versions of Smolen so that you and your partner can be sure the two of you are on the same wavelength.

The Smolen convention is used when you are 5-4 or 4-5 in the majors and is used after two Stayman sequences:

- 1) 1NT - 2♣ - 2♦
- 2) 2NT - 3♣ - 3♦

The rules for Smolen change if you are using Puppet Stayman, which will be covered next issue.

Since opener has denied a 4-card major, the goal is usually to either find a 5-3 major suit fit or play in no-trump. Furthermore, since with only one 5-card major you would use a Jacoby transfer (or just bid your major suit) instead of Stayman, bidding a major after the 2♦ response shows at least 5-4 or 4-5 in the majors.

Using standard methods, if Responder now bids a major, it shows 5 of that major and 4 of the other major, and is forcing. The major downsides are that the weaker hand will now be declarer and that you are in a game forcing auction.

The simplest version of Smolen attacks the downsides this way: you bid your 4 card major at the 2 level. If opener has 3 cards in the other major, opener can bid the 3 card major to play in the 5-3 fit; otherwise opener re-bids no-trump to deny a fit. This makes the strong hand the declarer, but still leaves you with a forcing auction.

The next version attacks the problem differently. Over the 2♦ response, a major suit bid at the 2 level shows 5 of that major and 4 of the other, and is non-forcing. To create a forcing auction, you jump to the 3 level in your 4-card major. This allows both forcing and non-forcing auctions, but will make the weaker hand the declarer on the non-forcing auctions. Nothing is perfect.

There is a corollary (whether or not you are using Smolen) to show 6-4 or longer game forcing hands.

Consider these sequences:

- 1a) 1NT - 4♥/4♠
- 1b) 1NT - 4♦/4♥
- 2a) 1NT - 2♣ - 2♦ - 4♥/4♠
- 2b) 1NT - 2♣ - 2♦ - 4♦/4♥

Sequence #1a shows a 6-card major with a game forcing hand using standard methods. Sequence #1b shows the same hand using Texas Transfers (4♦ is a transfer to 4♥, 4♥ is a transfer to 4♠). The only reason to go through Stayman (sequences #2a and #2b) would be if you are at least 6-4 or 4-6. Without Texas, you just bid your 6 card major at the 4 level (sequence #2a). If you are using Texas, you can jump to the 4 level to transfer into your 6 card suit - and this is called Extended Texas Transfers.
