Editor's Corner



As I write this column, I am trying very hard to get this issue of *Bridging the Counties* completed in time so you receive it by December 1. I may not make it. For those of you who haven't heard, I had a major hard drive failure, so I couldn't work on the issue for over a week. If it arrives late to you because of that, I apologize.

Looking back at last year's December issue, I wrote about losing various knockout matches by 1 IMP. This year in Danbury, I proved it was possible to win a knockout match by 1 IMP, something that had seemed impossible to me.

I also wrote about the importance of having partnership agreements to handle the unexpected. Yet I just got done playing in a Swiss Teams with a partner where we had few agreements with lots of conventions. Someone should remind me to take my own advice.

At the Saturday night game at the recent sectional at the County Center, I set a new low standard for preempts. Both sides vulnerable, I was in first seat holding:

- ♠ 10 x x
- ♥ 10 x x x x
- ♦ x x
- ♣ 10 x x

No, I didn't preempt as the dealer (that's too light, even for me). But when it went:

Pass - Pass - Pass - 1♣

back to me, it was time to take drastic action before they could sort things out. So I overcalled 2♥ leading to a good result for us. My partner didn't bury me despite our heart fit - he realized if I didn't preempt the first time, I had a good reason and that he shouldn't bury me for a delayed one. Now that's an understanding partner!

Also at the recent sectional, I heard a lot of discussion about where stratifications should be set, and gripes from "C" players about having to play against "A" players. I feel the opposite. Playing against good players will help your game improve. And I also am against raising the limits on "B" and "C", because I feel that the upper limits are increasing too fast relative to masterpoint earnings. Do you feel you have to stay in Flight C forever?

photo finish - tied at the end of 96 boards, and decided in an 8 board playoff. Congratulations to a super team: Joe Grue, John Kranyak, John Hurd, Joel Woolridge, Ari Greenberg, Justin Lall, and their non-playing captain Bob Rosen. No team could have displayed better sportsmanship, ethics, comradery, team spirit, and, yes, even super bridge. The USBF and the ACBL should be very proud of this fine group of young men and their captain.

I came home, said hello to Ron, repacked some clothes, and headed off to District 3's Secaucus Regional. This was another successful regional that kicked off with a social bridge game for 84 players who had never played duplicate before. The event was arranged by Jesse Reissman and Cheryl Angel, and through a lot of hard work these newcomers to the game had a great time. This event was sponsored by District 3, with 3 units, including Unit 188, contributing to the advertising costs. Eight new members

joined the ACBL that day, and we are staying in touch with everyone that participated, encouraging them to go to clubs near their homes to play. Players liked the 7 PM starting times, and our attendance was just over 1,500 tables with a lot more playing in our newplicate games - a good sign.

The NAP District Finals held in Allendale was a great success - 62 tables with the greatest growth in Flight C, another good sign. And I suspect that Danbury, our final regional of the year, will show a gain in tables as well.

As this year draws to an end, I want to thank the Unit 188 Board for their part in re-electing me to serve as your District Director for another 3 years. It is a privilege to represent District 3 on the National Board. I hope all of the things you would like to see happen in the ACBL are happening. If they aren't, you need to let me know so I can work for change.

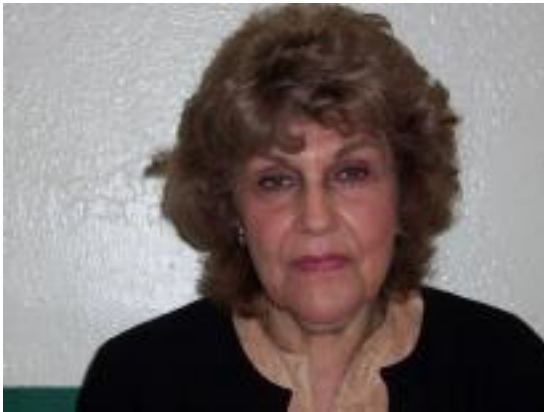

Co-sponsoring the Golden Apple for the 23rd year is the Westchester County Department of Parks, Recreation and Conservation. Westchester medallions will be presented to the winning players in both flights.

Changes to the Closed Westchester Tournament

This year the Friday afternoon game will only be held at the Bridge Deck, and it will be starting earlier at 1:00 PM. There will be a separate 0-750 game run concurrently with the open game.

As usual, there will be a complimentary cold buffet dinner between sessions.

On Saturday, there will be two separate sessions at 1:00 PM and 7:00 PM at Riverview. The winners of the afternoon game will receive the Harriet Aks Memorial Trophy. In between sessions, there will be a cocktail hour and dinner. At the Annual Meeting, new life masters will be recognized.

The tournament concludes with the Golden Apple Swiss (see left column for details).

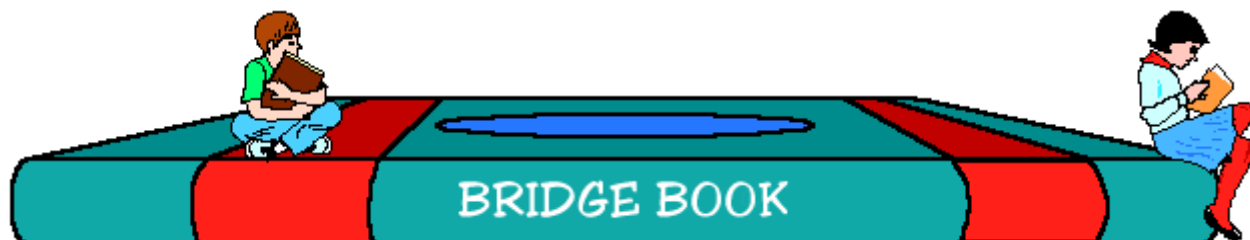

Puppet Stayman With Advanced Smolen

The Convention Hall article in the March 2005 issue of *Bridging the Counties* was about the Smolen convention as an addition to Stayman. The June 2005 article took it a step further and discussed integrating Smolen with Puppet Stayman. However, the basic Puppet Stayman has two problems - it wrong sides the contract in 4-4 major fits, and you lose Garbage Stayman. This article will explain how these problems can be rectified by using a more complicated version of Smolen.

Garbage Puppet Stayman can be played. After 1NT - 2♣ (alert) - 2♦ (alert), 2♥ or 2♠ is natural and non-forcing. On this sequence the weaker hand will be playing the contract. 2♥ and 2♠ only promise 4 card suits, although it could be 5 cards if Responder is 5-4 in the majors.

To create a game forcing auction with one 4 card major, Responder jumps to 3♥ or 3♠ in the suit Responder lacks 4 cards in. So with a 3=4=1=5 distribution, Responder jumps to 3♠ to show four hearts. And with a 4=3=1=5 distribution, Responder jumps to 3♥ showing four spades. If the 4-4 fit in a major has been found, opener goes to 4 of the major; otherwise opener re-bids 3NT. The jumps have to be alerted.

With a game forcing 4-4 in the majors, Responder can re-bid 3♦ (alert) to show both majors. Opener then bids a 4 card major to set the strain. If Responder has a 4 card major with 5+ diamonds and slam interest, opener must re-bid 4♦, as 3♦ is no longer natural.

So what does Responder do with an invitational hand? Responder re-bids 2NT as a catch-all invitation, with or without a 4 card major. If opener cannot accept the invitation, opener simply passes 2NT. You lose the ability to play a 4-4 major fit partial at the 3 level, but, especially at matchpoints, the loss is small.

If opener wishes to accept the invitation, opener re-bids 3♣ (alert). This asks Responder to describe the major suit holdings. 3♦ (alert) shows both majors. 3♥ (alert) shows 4 spades. And 3♠ (alert) shows 4 hearts. Lacking a 4 card major, Responder bids 3NT. These responses are the same as if Responder had a game forcing hand. Opener then passes 3NT, or bids game in the 4-4 major fit.

Alternatively, there is the simpler "Expert Smolen". After 1NT-2♣ (alert)-2♦ (alert), 2♥ is non-forcing. Responder may be 5-4 either way in the majors. 2♠ (alert) is the invitational bid with 5-4 (either way) in the majors. 3♦ and jumps to 3 of the major are as outlined above and are game forcing. The gain in simplicity is offset by possibly inferior fits being played in, as well as wrong sided contracts.

Lastly, there is Extended Texas. After 1NT-2♣-2♦, 4♦/4♥ are Texas transfers to 4♥/4♠, just as if Puppet Stayman hadn't been used. Responder is 6-4 and transferring into the 6 card suit.

Advanced Reverse Drury

INTRODUCTION

Why play Drury?

1) After partner has opened a major in any position, and the next player has doubled, a redouble shows 10+ points, and warns opener that the opponents may not have an 8 card fit, so that a penalty double may be there. A raise to 3 of the major is available as preemptive.

2) In third or fourth position, when Responder has 3 card support and a limit raise, he does not have to get to the 3 level to invite game when there may be only 7 or 8 trumps. In third seat, partner may want to open a 4 card major for lead directing purposes when he is light on points. A raise to 3 of the major should be preemptive.

Why play Advanced Reverse Drury instead of Drury?

1) By playing reverse Drury, 2♦ can be used to investigate Responder's major suit holdings.

2) Since the number of points needed for game is 26, minus three points for every trump over 8, opener can investigate game without being forced to the three level when there are only 8 trumps.

3) When opener has opened 1♠, he can investigate Responder's heart holding by bidding 2♥ even without interest in game. This denies interest in game.

Why Advanced Reverse Drury instead of Double Barreled Drury?

1) The price of using Double Barreled Drury is that it takes away from a natural 2♦ bid, which is needed over a double to deny 10+ points, deny 3 card support, and show 5+ diamonds. 2♦ is also needed over a third or fourth seat opener as natural.

2) Why tell the opponents you have an extra trump, when opener has no interest in game. The opponents are more likely to push you to the 3 level if they know they are more likely to have a fit.

ADVANCED REVERSE DRURY

Reverse Drury is used in any seat after a double, and after any interference after a third or fourth seat opener. The 2C bid is Reverse Drury in all of these sequences:

P - P - 1♥ - 1♠; 2♣

P - P - 1♠ - Dbl; 2♣

P - P - 1♥ - 1NT; 2♣

Although it may not be as useful to play 2♣ as Reverse Drury over 1NT interference, it is important to make the bidding consistent over all interference.

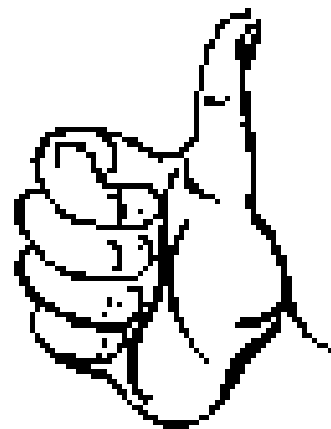
